## Outstanding Programs

Lubbock-Cooper ISD offers a wide variety of state and federal programs, including Special Education, Title I, Gifted/Talented, English as a Second Language, Dyslexia, Career and Technology Education, Optional Extended Year Program, as well as many local programs, such as the Acceleration Academy, the After-School Program and the Summer Enrichment Program, all designed to better serve each individual student.

The Pathways Academic Initiative is for grades 6-12, and is designed to raise ACT and SAT scores by implementing rigorous courses for students in the Accelerated and Advanced Placement Pathways. Students can also earn college credit through Tech Prep and dual-credit courses, as well as Advanced Placement courses.

## Did you know?

In 1936, five small school districts were consolidated to form the Cooper Rural School District. In the early 1970's, the name of the District was changed to Lubbock-Cooper ISD. Located in the southern portion of Lubbock County, LCISD encompasses an area of approximately 116 square miles. Three of the District's campuses are located in the unincorporated community of Woodrow, and two campuses are located in the northern part of the District just inside the city of Lubbock.

As a result of Lubbock-Cooper ISD's impressive academic accomplishments and reputation for maintaining a safe and orderly learning environment, the student population has been growing at a rapid rate in recent years. In fact, the student population of the District has grown by 1,165 in the past five years, making LCISD the fastest growing district on the South Plains.
